132,000 health consultations were provided to children and families in Uruzgan province, Afghanistan.

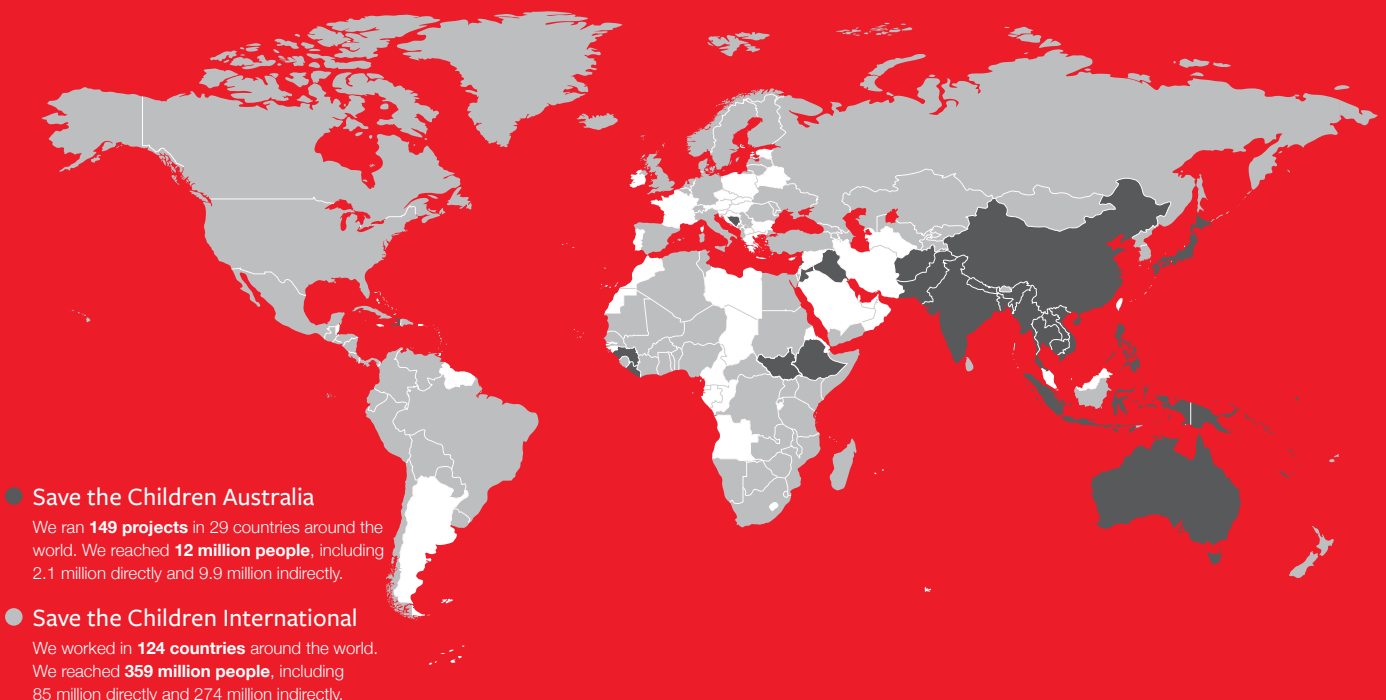


400 school libraries and book banks were established in Pakistan, reaching more than **276,000 children.**

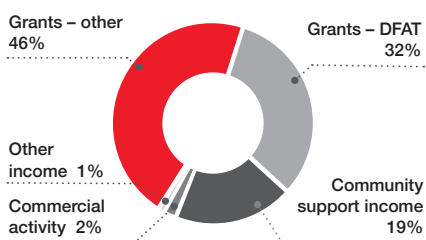

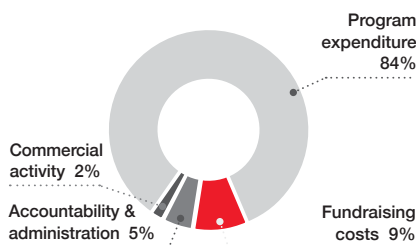

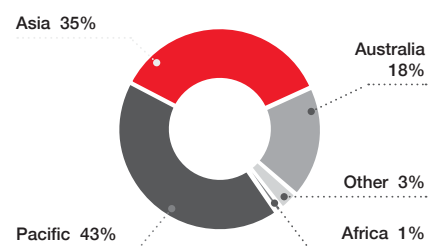
Where the \$ came from
