#### What we do

Save the Children is one of Australia's largest aid and development agencies dedicated to helping children. We work in Australia and overseas to protect children from harm and help them access quality education and health services.

**Humanitarian:** In 2013, we responded to more than 25 humanitarian crises and reached 1.4 million children and adults. Our responses included Typhoon Haiyan in the Philippines and the Syrian conflict, as well as flooding and bushfires in Australia.

**Education:** We help all children access quality education, no matter where they live. Our work includes improving the quality of schools in Pakistan, educating children in immigration detention in Nauru, and improving school attendance in remote Australia.


**Health:** We provide basic healthcare for the world's most vulnerable children and train health workers in newborn and maternal care. We also treat children for preventable disease like pneumonia, diarrhoea, malaria and measles.

**Protection:** Our child protection programs strengthen families and communities so they can safely care for their children. In Australia this includes parenting programs, refuges and keeping kids off the streets. Overseas we support both rural and urban communities to protect children from abuse.






## Where the \$ came from
